<u>A year in review 2023</u> <u>Rev. Joshua Jon Ehmke</u> <u>Portland Congregational Church</u>

Our congregation has been blessed with new members and families, as well our established members' continue to grow in unity and relationships. We have had many members step into leadership, fulfilling different roles of ministry. We have rebooted our youth group, continued serving the hurting through Grief Share, meet for midweek bible studies periodically throughout the year (covering marriages, relationships & The Awe of God). Our small groups are continuing through men's & women's bible study and prayer group. Young ones are being reached through children's church & nursery (personal shoutout, to those volunteers!!). Worship team, missions, online presence are other areas where gifts and talents are being used for the Lord. Once again, the "I am Loved" event was hosted at the Portland Community park, and we partnered with other churches & organizations to do our annual outreach to the community. My heart is touched by the commitment and dedication this church body shows to serving the Lord by serving His local body (the church) and those in need. We can easily lose sight of all the accomplishments and acts of service this church has made, which I've only mentioned some (there are so many other acts of service to the body, which go on every week, that each of you do for eachother; (Matt 10:42)) it's so good to be part of Christ's body.

With the blessings, and rewards granted to our church, God also brought times of testing. Before the beginning of the year, God was speaking that He would do some shaking within our church. If we are His, there will be times of testing, but as I learned this year, "a faith that can't be tested, can't be trusted". ASSOCIATE PASTOR REPORT

I would like to thank Pastor Joshua and Liz Ehmke and the congregation for the privilege of serving this year in 2023 as an associate part-time Pastor. My duties and responsibilities this year included Sunday Worship Service call to worship offertory and closing song and also occasionally filling in to preach for Pastor Joshua on Sunday and at the man's Bible study and midweek classes. In addition my duties throughout the year include doing Hospital visitation, nursing home visitations and home visitations for elderly, shut-ins and those battling illness. I also make weekly text and calls to check on those who are not in church or who are struggling and need prayer for healing or are battling some issues. In addition, I am at the weekly prayer meeting every Tuesday morning and get a weekly copy of the praise and prayer list for those battling any issues. I also do periodic counseling throughout the week for those who are struggling with any issues or concerns that they are battling in their life. Pastor Joshua Ehmke Adam Plyler and myself also meet once a week for 2-3 hours to discuss the people who have been visited or need to be visited or need to be called or texted. During this meeting we pray for those who are battling any emotional, physical or spiritual issues. Included in this meeting we also discuss biblical issues, carefully discuss future sermons and what we think the Lord and the Holy Spirit is speaking to the congregation in this season. The weeks that I preach I spend most of my time preparing for the Sunday sermon however I still try and find some time to text, call or visit those who need. However Pastor Joshua and Liz also fill in with visitations, calls and texts the weeks that I am preaching. Also once a month there is a spiritual committee and council meeting that I attend dealing with any spiritual or business issues of the church. This year Adam Plyler Pastor Joshua and I helped to set the vision for and launch of the youth group. I also participated in occasional teachings at the youth meetings. Throughout the year I help Pastor supervise different projects that he puts me in charge of or needs my help contributing to. I make a good effort to attend the midweek fellowship regularly and the yearly grief share classes that are run by Sharon and Carol. Also Pastor has had me in the past teach some of the midweek classes. If I am not teaching the midweek classes I still make an effort to be there at the midweek classes to learn and grow with the rest of the church.

Since my dad passed away in December 24th, 2021 it has been my honor to be assisting Pastor Joshua and the church here at Portland Congregational Church. It has been an unbelievable season of blessing for me where I have spiritually emotionally and physically grown stronger by being a part of the church. I am so grateful for the friendships and the relationships that I have built and the powerful congregation that I serve. I hope and pray that people have been blessed by my Ministry here at PCC throughout the year. I look forward to continuing another year of serving Pastor Joshua and Liz Ehmke and the congregation here at PCC.






